Objectives of the course	This curricular unit aims to improve students' ability to communicate effectively in English by: - Increasing students' confidence and fluency in English, particularly in listening and speaking - Improving students' level of English through a combination of language input and practice in the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, especially related to the tourism field - Developing the study skills that will enable students to continue to learn English throughout their Tourism course Improving their command of functional language - Improving their command of spoken and written discourse and formal and informal styles - Providing them with listening, speaking and writing practice contextualised in the tourism field - Improving their pronunciation, stress and intonation

Course contents	I.Extending and reviewing language structures; II. Phonetic Alphabet; III. Expressing numbers, dates, prices, distances; IV. Explaining timetables and schedules; V. Exchanging greetings, introductions, goodbyes and communicating routines and predictable tourism related information; VI. Countries and nationalities: a. Explaining facts and statistics about a country or region; b. Describing resources and features; VII. Identifying and describing jobs in tourism: a. Describing the different job roles in hotels, catering services, airlines, ground transports and other tourism related industries; b. Understanding and explain the skills, qualities and qualifications needed to work in these roles; VIII. Producing a CV and cover letter; IX. Writing a personal statement; X. Taking part in job interviews; XI. Talking about likes & dislikes and holiday experiences.		
Assessment methods	A communicative approach will be used. Students will be given the widest possible opportunities to use English for self-expression; they will learn it by using as well as analysing it. As far as assessment is concerned, there is a focus on a holistic approach that monitors teaching effectiveness and student learning in multiple ways. Students will be evaluated		

	through different means: an oral exam, a written exam, written and oral tasks as well as their participation and attitudes.
